The NETWORLD project contributes to the Danube Transnational Programme objectives and priority area 2 (Environment and culture responsible Danube region) by strengthening the joint and integrated approaches in documenting, preserving, managing and promoting the cultural heritage in the Danube region.

WALK OF PEACE BRAND



Based on the cultural-architectural heritage of the First World War along the former Southwestern Front between the Austro-

Hungarian Monarchy and the Kingdom of Italy, the idea of the "Walk of Peace" had been initiated by the Austrian Dolomitenfreunde Association in the 1970s. It had been developed further by Slovenia's Foundation Walk of Peace and Italian associations along the former Isonzo Front, which formed a part of the Southwestern Front.

Within the NETWORLD project activities, the Walk of Peace brand will be shared and demonstrated in the Danube region as a common brand of the heritage of the First World War. The brand contributes to the commemoration of all casualties of WWI and promotes the values of peace and respect. It also contributes to raiseing the awareness of the WWI heritage and promotes sustainable tourism development.

Since 2016, the "The Walk of Peace from the Alps to the Adriatic – Heritage of the First World War" in Slovenia has been included in the UNESCO Tentative List.
