Background:

ESC – the International Executive Service Corps – is a U.S.-based nonprofit that seeks private enterprise solutions to problems of poverty in developing countries and around the world. By providing a mix of technical assistance and volunteer expert support, IESC works with emerging industries, financial institutions, and governments to stabilize economic environments, increase opportunity, and promote growth.

The USAID funded Workforce and Higher Access to Market (WHAM) Activity is a three-year program that aims to stimulate job creation by advancing Bosnia's trade integration with and expansion into European Union and regional markets. The activity will accomplish this primarily via grants with SMEs. This activity aims to increase exports by 30 percent for assisted enterprises and create over 1,000 new jobs, of which half are for youth and 30 percent are for women.

WHAM will improve the capacity of high-growth and exporting or export-ready small and medium enterprises via grants focused on three intervention areas:

- 1. Improve workforce in targeted sectors (metal processing, wood processing, and textiles/footwear).
- 2. Increase market access.
- 3. *Improve product quality (including new technology related to quality management and certification) and capacity building.*

Problem Statement and Objectives of the Assignment:

Because of advancements in digital technology and an increased focus on supply chain risk and globalization, supply chains are expanding in scope and companies in B&H are faced with a need to adjust their practices to accommodate such change. Most of companies that IESC is supporting are suppliers, and the workshop content should provide them with an up-to-date and specific knowledge and expertise of the process, management of the process as well as emphasis on new developments, trends and best practices.



WHAM is organizing two two-days workshops in Sarajevo and in Banja Luka with an aim to cover the following set of topics related to the supply chain area of expertise:

- 1. Geo-Political Impacts
- 2. Weather Related Risk
- 3. Manufacturing and Shipping Locations
- 4. Product Information
- 5. Accessible Inventory Information

- 7. Customer Service
- 8. Time to Delivery Improvement Methods
- 9. Lead Time and Delivery Statistics
- 10.Payment Terms
- 11.Contactable References
- 6. Know Their Scalability 12.Check Certifications

The assignment for the successful candidate initials assistance with all processes and activities that are within the scope of the two-days workshop. The main task is assistance to the lead Expert Volunteer. However, the activity will have preparations and post-workshop segments. In order to gather as much as possible intelligence and prepare new workshops in SCM, the Student Volunteer will communicate with all beneficiaries that Expert Volunteer and Volunteer Engagement Manager select. This communication, via telephone or through structured surveys will provide sufficient information on SME's that will provide succeeding Expert Volunteer with material to plan and implement future one-onone sessions.

- Providing assistance to the Volunteer Engagement Manager
- Providing close assistance to the lead expert volunteer throughout the activity
- Assisting in organizing, designing, and gathering the beneficiaries and intermediaries' surveys via SurveyMonkey
- Facilitation of the Workshops activities; help with communication with companies and the workshop materials development

Qualifications:

- 1. 3rd year or MBA student
- 2. Ability to work effectively in cross-cultural contexts;
- 3. Self-motivated, proactive, detail-oriented, reliable, professional team player, who is a strong people person and communicator, with good inter-personal skills;
- 4. Working proficiency in English (adequate reading/writing) and the ability to express one's self clearly and concisely;
- 5. Good computer skills in MS Office, and willingness to learn additional online tools; previous experience in work with SurveyMonkey is an asset.
